- We use them to find out more information about someone or something.
- They start with the letters 'wh'.
- These words will appear at the start of the sentence.



What - is used to ask for **information** about something.

Who - is used to ask about a **person**.

Which - is used to ask about **choice**.

Present Perfect Tense

- You use present perfect tense to talk about things you did in the past without saying the exact time they happened, to talk about things you have never done or to ask a question.
- To make the present perfect tense, you use **has or have** before a verb in the past tense.
- To make a sentence about things you haven't done you use **have + never + past tense verb**.
- To make a sentence using present perfect tense to ask a question you use **have + you ever + past tense verb**.

Noun/have or has/p.p

I	have	been	to Dubai
he/she	has	been	to Dubai
I	have never	been	to Dubai
he/she	has never	been	to Dubai



Have	Yo u	ever	been	to Dubai?
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- **Past Tense Verbs**

- For regular verbs you add 'ed' to create the past tense.
- Irregular verbs follow different rules – for these you must learn each individually – use past participle for Present Perfect.
- If a verb ends in a consonant then a 'y' remove the 'y' and add 'ied' to make past tense
 - eg. try = tried

regular verbs		verbs ending in 'y'		irregular verbs

shout	Shouted	cry	cried	drive	drove	Driven

Adjectives

- To make your writing and speaking stronger, you can use adjectives.
- An adjective is a word that describes a person, place or thing.

Some adjectives

tall/short	fat/thin	old/young	sad/happy	loud/quiet
soft/hard	hot/cold	dry/wet	light/heavy	hard-working/lazy

Using 'wh' Question Words 2

- These are words we use to ask questions.
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- These words will appear at the start of the sentence.

When – is used to ask about a **time**.

Where – is used to ask about a **place**.

Why – is used to ask for a **reason/explanation**.

Using Past Continuous Tense

- We use **past continuous** to talk about actions that started in the past but are still happening or happened for some amount of time.
- We also use **past continuous** tense to describe past actions as they happened, not after they were finished.



- We can even use describe a past action time as another **past continuous** tense to that happened at the same action.
- To form the **past continuous** tense we use was or were before an – ing verb. Was is use for singular nouns, and were is used for plural nouns.
- We can use the **past continuous** tense to describe a past action that happened at the same time as another action.
- To do this, we use the word while at the beginning of the sentence.

Noun	was/were	'ing' verb	
I/she/he	was	painting	a picture.
They/we	were	painting	pictures.

Nouns

- **Singular nouns** – when we are talking about just one person or thing.
- **Plural nouns** – when we are talking about more than one person or thing.

'ing' Verbs

- To make an -ing verb all we must do is add the letter 'ing' onto the end of a verb.
- If the verb ends with the letter 'e' you must remove this before adding 'ing'.

Verb	'ing' verb
talk	Talking
play	Playing
Drive	driving
