To form the past simple tense with other verbs add "d or ed"

singular	I	watched TV. played football. ate an apple. drank orange juice. felt happy.

### Key words:

Yesterday, last, ago.

### Spelling changes with past simple

1. If the verb ends with "y", we change it to -i and add -ed :
  - Try – tried
  - spy – spied
2. If the verb ends with "e" , we add just a "d" (not "ed"):
  - closed – closed (NOT: closeed)
  - measure – measured
3. Double the final consonant if the verb ends in a (CVC)\*:
  - plan – planned
  - stop – stopped




